- **Provision of a Digital Communication Platform for the Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC)**

- **NHS England blog: Online access to GP records: realising opportunities and overcoming challenges**
 - Over 600 GP practices have switched-on access to new GP record entries, meaning an additional 2.3 million patients can read new entries in their health records
 - This initiative is providing patients with more information about their health, and is hoped to benefit practices by providing patients with appointment information, reducing the need for them to contact their GP surgery

- **NHS England and NHS Digital complete merger**
 - Following parliamentary approval, on the 1st of February NHS England and NHS Digital legally merged. This establishment of a single NHS organisation in England aims to transform the NHS through focusing on data, digital and technology while delivering more cohesive decision making

 - This week NHS England published their delivery plan for recovering urgent and emergency care services, prioritising innovative digital care as a key part of this solution
 - Some relevant points for digital providers include improvements to be made to data collection during discharge, the scaling up of virtual wards as an alternative to hospital care and increased support for patients using digital technology to manage health

 - Associated Director of GP IT, Dan Wintercross, highlights the advantages of the early adopter programme which is providing GP practices with the ability to shape the future of data, digital and technology across primary care

- **CQC to adjust regulatory approach to respond to winter pressures**
 - Following higher than anticipated winter pressures the CQC have announced that they will adjust their regulatory activity till the end of March 2023
 - While maintaining high safety for patients using these services remains a key priority, they have highlighted that it is important to appreciate the unique context providers are currently operating in

 - The Telegraph highlights that despite continued increases in staffing and funding across the NHS it is struggling to cope as A&E services remain continuously overwhelmed
 - They argue that the NHS requires a structural reform with increased technological innovation, something which could come in the form of a Royal Commission

 - Following NHS England’s plans to increase the scope of Virtual wards, retired teacher Carlo Zamboni discusses his experience of being discharged from hospital following a fall
 - He highlights that a hospital at home plan (achieved through virtual wards) could help people like him who are struggling to cope at home alone but is not a replacement for having real people. He urges the NHS to honour their commitment of cradle-to-grave care.
